Julietta's Place

The Women's Outreach has a 25 year history in Red Deer and Central Alberta as an advocate for women and their children. While the delivery of services and programs has evolved over the years, the mandate to assist women who have chosen to pursue a safer, healthier, and more secure life for themselves and their children has remained consistent.

As a result of this evolution, the Women's Outreach has a broad focus. The agencies ability to change and adapt our programs and services to meet the needs with our community makes us unique. However, it also brings its challenges; in that, we rely on our strong base of funders and community partners to financially support our agency.

The affordable housing need, for individuals escaping family violence, was first identified in the Red Deer Community Action Plan for Domestic Violence and Bullying. This need was further supported through the Homelessness Partnering Strategy developed through the Mayor's task force to end homelessness in Red Deer. This identified community need has brought the Women's Outreach to its next step in growth and making a difference in the lives of women.



The development of **Julietta's Place**, an affordable ten (10) unit housing project, is a first for Central Alberta.

Currently, there is no affordable housing available to women and children escaping domestic violence, or crisis, circumstances.



Life changes are difficult in the best of times. This housing project will provide a secure base, an essential component to the achievement of long-term stability.

Julietta's Place will ensure a safe, secure, supportive and healthy environment for these women and their children, during this turbulent time of change in their lives.

Their success will be in not having to walk this journey alone. Long-term support is critical toward maintaining a safer life, and through a sustainable resource network the Women's Outreach will provide access to those programs and services that will assist them in living an independent life ~ safe from abuse.

In Memory of Julietta Sorensen

Julietta Sorensen, a long time resident of Red Deer, passed away in April 2004, at 96 years of age. Together with her husband Gordon, they operated what is now Prairie Bus Lines and were pioneers in the early delivery of a transit system to the City of Red Deer. Julietta was respected and well known for her kind and compassionate heart, as she generously gave of herself to help others. This often meant, especially during wartime, opening her home to strangers seeking shelter and a hot meal. Julietta's Place is located on the Sorensen family home site.

Her caring spirit to quietly assist those most in need ~ is the legacy of Julietta's Place.
